## Credit Check

- Very closely look at your credit checker to ensure you are fulfilling all your graduation requirements
  - How many English, Social Studies, Science, Math, Relationships, Computer, Elective classes do you need?
- You **MUST** register for failed required classes that you did not make up already (summer school or taken the class again ... and passed)
  - English, Math, Social Studies, Science, Comp 1, Relationships

## English - Reminder

### 12th grade:

- Oral Language Requirement
  - Intro to Theatre, Oral Comm Strategies
- English Elective (need to take 1 full credit) or AP English

\*\*\*Need English teacher signature on registration form\*\*\*

## Can I Graduate Early?

- Who qualifies for early graduation?
- At the end of junior year, you must have 23 credits to be on track to graduate in Jan.
  - Only complete lines 1-8 on registration form (only here 2 quarters)
- Or, 21 credits to be on track to graduate in March
  - Only complete lines 1-12 on registration (only here 3 quarters)
  - Need to fill out a form for early graduation by **end of junior year**

## 4 Year College Bound Students

- 3 years of Math (some require 4 years of math)
  - Some colleges do not count "Statistics" as a math credit, rather, an elective credit
- 3.5 years of Social Studies
- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Science, inc. a lab (Chem/Anat)
- 2 years Foreign Language

## 2 Year College Bound Students

Same requirements to graduate from high school, except some health programs require up through Chemistry and/or Anatomy.

## College

- Must take core classes during senior year even if have completed requirements through high school (Eng, Math, Social Studies, Science)
- Colleges want to see that you are challenging yourself

## Music Students

Must register for entire year of music.

- This will take up 4 lines
- Band and choir - only use 4 lines; not 8 (on registration sheet)

Can take skinny class if you are a single music student

- Intro to Theatre, Art 1, Comp 1,
- Write the skinny class on a music line, not on one of your other 16 lines

## Earning College Credit

- AP Classes
  - Art, US History, Psych, English, Calc, Stats, Bio
- PLTW classes
  - Intro to Eng, POE, Digital Elect, Eng Design and Design

## Earning College Credit

### Advanced Standing Classes:

**Transcribed Credit** - Direct credit from CVTC. Upon successful completion, grades are posted to an official transcript from the college and tabulated into your college GPA. Generally transferable to other colleges.

**Advanced Standing** - Credit is delayed until you apply to CVTC or another technical school in WI. You can earn the credit, but the grade does not apply to your college GPA. Must earn a B or better.

## Youth Options / Tutor / Class Aide

Do not register for Youth Options. There is a process for this. If you are in the program, we will change your schedule if needed.

- Listen for announcements for an upcoming info meeting
- First deadline is March 1

Tutor / Class Aide - Fill out a form, and we will change your schedule.

## Phy Ed / Study Hall

- Max of 3 phy ed classes per year. Need 1 more phy ed class between 11-12th grade
- Cannot register for study halls except if a single music student (still need at least one skinny class)

## Learn to Earn and Work Experience

- To qualify for the Work Study program their senior year, students need to take Learn to Earn their Junior year (usually 4th Quarter)
- Work Experience is a program where students can leave school early to go to work and earn HS elective credit
- The Work Experience is supervised by a high school teacher

## Newer Courses

### Math for the Trades-TC (for Juniors and/or Seniors)- 2 Quarters

- Math skills needed in a wide variety of trade, technical, and other occupational areas, (including plumbing, automotive, electrical, & construction trades)
- Counts as a Math Credit (not NCAA accepted)
- Can be taken after Algebra 2/CORE or instead of Algebra 2/CORE

### Criminal Justice- TC (for Juniors and/or Seniors)- 1 Quarter

- Counts as a Social Studies elective
- Students need to choose between Psychology, Sociology, Economics, AP Psychology, APUSH, or Criminal Justice to meet the SS requirement

## NCAA

- Students planning to play in Division 1 or 2 athletics in college need to register for the NCAA their Junior year (there is a cost).
- Students will need to meet with a counselor to make sure they are taking the correct classes (some EHS credits are not accepted by NCAA).

## Signatures

- Parent
  - Review entire schedule and sign
- Teacher
  - Signatures are required for math and english

## Classes that Run Longer Than 1 Quarter

- If a class runs longer than 1 quarter, it will have 1 number with A - D after each term
  - Math, Spanish, Science, AP
    - Alg 2A, Alg 2B
    - Span. 2A, Span. 2B
  - These classes need 2 lines
  - Choir/Band needs 4 lines

## Permission Forms

- Permission forms for AP English and Studio Art are in the course description book
- Must have teacher permission

## Career Plans of Study

If you aren't sure what elective classes to take, refer to the career plans of study in the course description book.

- Example - A career in the Human Services career cluster - what classes would be recommended to take in HS? (Psychology, Child Care, etc)

- Give this some thought. It is not always easy for us to make schedule changes (domino effect)
- You also need many signatures to add or drop a class
- You will now have more options than you did as a underclassman so look through course description book

**SENIOR SCHEDULING BULLETIN 2017 - 2018 (Class of 2018)**

Elsworth High School Senior class graduation requirements are as follows:

4 credits of English	1.00 credits of Physical Education
2 credits of Science	1 credit of Health
2 credits of Math	20 credits of Electives
30 credits of Social Studies	11 credits of Additional
30 credits of Computer I	27 credits required for Graduation

**\*The three credits of Health required for graduation must be fulfilled by completing Algebra I (or Algebra I Core), General or Community CORE, and Algebra II Algebra I CORE, as well as the "Track".**

**ENGAGE:** You must sign up for 1 credit from the Jr-Sr English selection. Please see your instructor suggested placement.

**SOCIAL STUDIES:** You may sign up for American Government (100).

**SCIENCE:** Required classes are Integrated Science II and Biology. During Junior/Senior year - 1 credit must be selected from Chemistry II and IB, Applied Chemistry and IB, Anatomy and Physiology II and IB, Physics II and IB, Plant Science/Anatomical II, Food Science II, and Dissection of Animals II and IB. Electives are encouraged to take a variety of Science to better prepare them for their transition careers.

**HEALTH:** You must take a year of health - see your instructor for placement.

**FOREIGN LANGUAGE:** Most four year colleges require students to complete Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra 2 as minimum math preparation.

**RELIGION:** Students must receive 1 personal education credit between high school 4 senior years.

**RELATIONSHIPS:** Between grades 10-12, a total of Relationships is required.

**EARLY GRADUATION**

The student and their parents must fill out the Request for Early Graduation form **prior to the beginning of the 2018 year.**

- The student must meet all of the school's graduation requirements (including Service Hours);
- A counselor will review the request to check student's eligibility;
- A student who graduates early will receive their diploma at the regularly scheduled commencement ceremony.

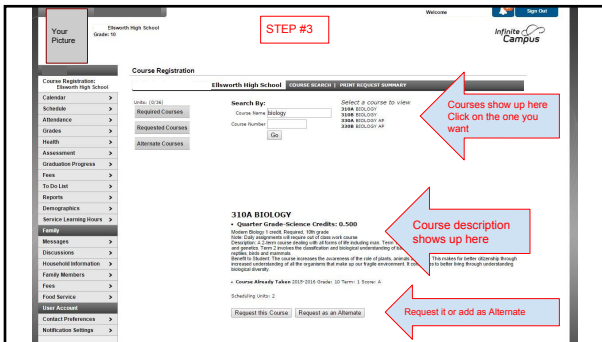
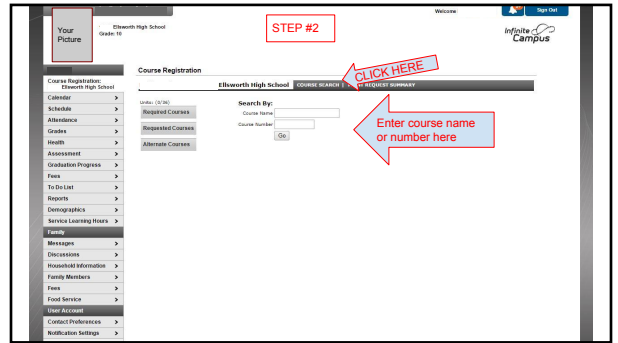
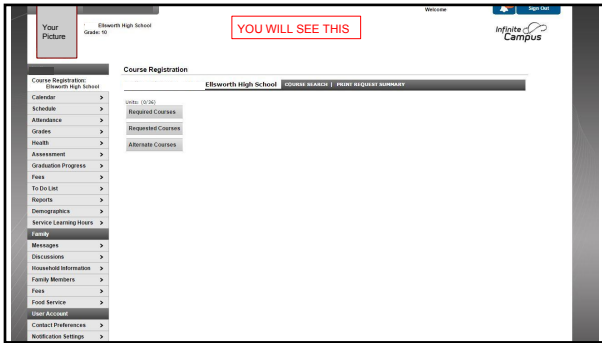
