Credit Check

- Very closely look at your credit checker to ensure you are fulfilling all your graduation requirements
 - How many English, Social Studies, Science, Math, Relationships, Computer, Elective classes do you need?
- You MUST register for failed required classes that you did not make up already (summer school or taken the class again ... and passed)
 - English, Math, Social Studies, Science, Comp 1, Relationships

4 Year College Bound Students

3 years of Math (some require 4 years of math)
3.5 years of Social Studies
4 years of English
3 years of Science, inc. a lab (Chem/Anat)
2 years Foreign Language

2 Year College Bound Students

Same requirements to graduate from high school, except some health programs require up through Chemistry and/or Anatomy.

English - New This Year

11 grade:

- English 11 (meets Writing and Reading Requirement) or AP Literature or AP Composition

12th grade:

- Oral Language Requirement
 - Intro to Theatre, Oral Comm Strategies
- English Elective (need to take 1 full credit) or AP English

Need English teacher signature on registration form

Music Students

Must register for entire year of music.

- This will take up 4 lines
- Band and choir - only use 4 lines; not 8 (on registration sheet)

Can take skinny class if you are a single music student

- Intro to Theatre, Art 1, Comp 1,
- Write the skinny class on a music line, not on one of your other 16 lines

Earning College Credit

AP Classes

- US History, Psych, English, Stats, Bio

PLTW classes

- Intro to Eng, POE, Digital Elect, Eng Design and Design
 - Have to fill out paperwork with teacher in order to receive credit from MSOE

Advanced Standing Classes:

Transcribed Credit - Direct credit from CVTC. Upon successful completion, grades are posted to an official transcript from the college and tabulated into your college GPA. Generally transferable to other colleges.

Advanced Standing - Credit is delayed until you apply to CVTC or another technical school in WI. You can earn the credit, but the grade does not apply to your college GPA. Must earn a B or better.

Youth Options / Tutor / Class Aide

Do not register for Youth Options. There is a process for this. If you are in the program, we will change your schedule if needed.

- Listen for announcements for an upcoming info meeting
- First deadline is March 1

Tutor / Class Aide - Fill out a form, and we will change your schedule (a week before the term).

Phy Ed / Study Hall

- Max of 3 phy ed classes per year. Need 1 more phy ed class between 11-12th grade.
- Cannot register for study halls except if a single music student (still need at least one skinny class)

Learn to Earn and Work Experience

- To qualify for the Work Study program their senior year, students need to take Learn to Earn their Junior year
- Work Experience is a program where students can leave school early to go to work and earn HS elective credit
- The Work Experience is supervised by a high school teacher

Newer Courses

Career Exploration! (for Juniors)- 1 Quarter

- Career exploration and planning using Career Cruising
- Will do a job shadow, internship, or visiting different businesses

Math for the Trades-TC (for Juniors and/or Seniors)- 2 Quarters

- Math skills needed in a wide variety of trade, technical, and other occupational areas, (including plumbing, automotive, electrical, & construction trades)
- Counts as a Math Credit (not NCAA accepted)
- Can be taken after Algebra 2/CORE or instead of Algebra 2/CORE

Criminal Justice- TC (for Juniors and/or Seniors)- 1 Quarter

- Counts as a Social Studies elective
- Students need to choose between Psychology, Sociology, Economics, AP Psychology, APUSH, or Criminal Justice to meet the SS requirement

NCAA

- Students planning to play in Division 1 or 2 athletics in college need to register for the NCAA their Junior year (there is a cost).
- Students will need to meet with a counselor to make sure they are taking the correct classes (some EHS credits are not accepted by NCAA).

Signatures

- Parent
 - Review entire schedule and sign
- Teacher
 - Signatures are required for Math, English, and Science

Classes that Run Longer Than 1 Quarter

- If a class runs longer than 1 quarter, it will have 1 number with A - D after each term
 - Math, Spanish, Science, AP
 - Alg 2A, Alg 2B (226A & B)
 - Span. 2A, Span. 2B
 - These classes need 2 - 4 lines
 - Choir/Band needs 4 lines
