

SENIOR SCHEDULING BULLETIN 2018 - 2019 (Class of 2019)

Ellsworth High School Subject area graduation requirements are as follows:

4 credits of English	1.50 credits of Physical Education
3 credits of Science	*Health Class
*3 credits of Math	.50 credit Relationships
3.50 credits of Social Studies	<u>11 credits of Electives</u>
.50 credit of Computer I	27 credits required for Graduation

*The three credits of Math required for graduation must be fulfilled by completing Algebra I or Algebra I CORE, Geometry or Geometry CORE, and Algebra II, Algebra II CORE, or Math for the Trades.

*The completion of a Health class is required to graduate from EHS. Most students completed this requirement with Health 8. If you did not complete Health at that time you must take a Health class while in high school.

ENGLISH: You must sign up for 1 credit from the Sr. English electives (2 classes- one should be an Oral Language requirement if not already done). Please see your instructor for suggested placement.

SOCIAL STUDIES: You must sign up for American Government (400).
*Between your junior & senior year you must sign up for a social studies elective: Psychology, Sociology, Economics, Criminal Justice, AP History, or AP Psychology.

SCIENCE: Required classes are Integrated Science 9 and Biology. During Junior/Senior year- 1 credit must be selected from Chemistry (A and B), Applied Chemistry (A and B), Anatomy and Physiology (A and B), Physics (A and B), Plant Science/Horticulture (.5), Food Science (.5), and Principles of Engineering (A and B). Students are encouraged to take 4 credits of Science to better prepare them for post-secondary options.

MATH: You must take a year of math – see your instructor for placement.
*Most four year colleges require students to complete Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra 2 as minimum math preparation. Note some colleges **do not** accept Statistics as a Math credit.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: Most four year colleges (including UW-Madison, UW-Eau Claire, and Minnesota colleges) have a two credit foreign language requirement for admission. It is your responsibility to check what other colleges require for foreign language.

PHY ED: Students must choose 1 physical education course between their junior & senior years.

RELATIONSHIPS: Between grades 10-12, .5 credit of Relationships is required.

1. The student and their parents must fill out the Request for Early Graduation form **prior to the completion of their junior year.**
2. The student must meet all of the school's graduation requirements (including Service Hours).
3. A counselor will review the request to check student's eligibility.
4. A student who graduates early will receive their diploma at the regularly scheduled commencement exercises.
